Let all-seeing Zeus be my witness:	
I would not wait silently, watching ruin	185
rather than deliverance advance on the city.	
I could never consider any man my friend	
who is an enemy of the state, knowing that	
this ship keeps us safe and only by sailing	
it straight can we determine our friends.	190
I will strengthen this state with such laws.	
Therefore, I have proclaimed to the people	
related laws concerning the sons of Oedipus.	
Eteokles, who died fighting for this city,	
who bested everyone with his spear,	195
we buried and performed all holy rites	
offered to the noble dead below.	
But Polynices, his own brother,	
who returned from exile seeking to incinerate	
his fatherland and the gods of his family,	200
who wished to consume kindred blood,	
to lead Thebans into slavery –	
it has been proclaimed throughout the city	
that no one honor him with burial or mourning,	
but leave him unburied, a corpse devoured	205
by birds and dogs, foul to see.
